12	Synopsis	<p>This course focuses on the legal aspects of Muslim property in Malaysia which are relevant to the <i>wakaf</i> property, <i>zakat</i>, inheritance, will, <i>hibah</i>, jointly acquired property, nominee's property and saved property. It discusses specifically the administration of <i>faraid</i>, the applicable laws including the Probate and Administration Act and the customary laws among Muslims in Malaysia. It covers some forms of practical training, concept, conditions and the method of distribution of estates and wills. This course will also discuss the administration of zakat and bait-ul-mal as financial institutions of an Islamic state and its administration in Malaysia. Discussion on the administration of zakat will include the current rate of zakat, the power to collect it and contemporary issues including zakat on income and its method of distribution.</p>
